

Rural Japan: Aging and depopulation

- Aging
- Fewer younger women
- Women are targeted as core human resources to maintain and build resilient rural communities.



Food Self-Sufficiency and Agriculture

- Food self-sufficiency rate (calorie base): 39%
- Agriculture, forestry and fisheries:
 0.9% of GDP, 3.2% of total employed
- Farm land: family-owned small land holdings
- Aging labor force: 66.4% of people employed in agriculture are over 65 years old
- Female ratio of core farmers: 43%

Women in Decision-making

- Percentage of women in various decisionmaking bodies in rural areas remains at only
 7 to 8 %.
- The Basic Plan for Gender Equality, national Action Plan, dedicates a chapter to rural women.
- Lack of women's participation in decisionmaking is not only limited to rural areas.
- Japan ranks 114 out of 144 countries in the Global Gender Gap Index (GGGI) of the World Economic Forum.

Policy Measures by the MAFF

- Training programs for women on agricultural management
- Family Management Agreement

decides the share of paid and unpaid household work, days off and salaries

"Nougyo-Joshi Project"

highlights women in agriculture through networking and collaboration with the business sector
